PRESIDENT'S REPORT

On behalf of the Board of the Saskatchewan Sports Hall of Fame (SSHF), I would like to thank the staff and volunteers for making 2013 an exciting and rewarding year. The top line strategy established in 2011 continues to serve as our organizational road map. This annual report will outline a few of the SSHF's key activities as we continue to progress through the goals established within the strategy.

• **Self-Help:** Move towards a selfsustaining business model to run parallel with Saskatchewan Lotteries core funding.

- The Sports Investors Club, now in its 2nd year, garnered 24 Teammates and 8 All Star contributors
- A comprehensive Admissions Policy was implemented
- New sponsor and fundraising partnerships were explored and developed
- The Board and staff participated in a Fundraising Strategic Planning session to re-affirm and expand the top line strategy
- The SSHF finished its 2nd consecutive fiscal year in positive financial territory
- Awareness: To amplify awareness of the SSHF within the province.
 - A President's Reception was hosted in Saskatoon in October and in Regina in November, 2012
 - Under the Collection Management partnership with the Saskatchewan Hockey Hall of Fame (Swift Current), 9 inductee exhibits were fabricated along with 3 general hockey-related exhibits
 - The re-launch of our website with full responsive capabilities and a whole new look and content
 - Our website and social media presence continued to produce gains in visits, length of stay and overall reach in every month of the past year
- **Board Development:** To create an effective and qualified Board that is conscious of its own role and responsibilities; that is motivated by the mission of the organization; and that is willing and able to actively participate in Board leadership.
 - Three new Board members were recruited Rebecca Conly, Laurel Garven and Justin Scott representing a youth movement within the Board
 - Action was taken to ensure that all vacant Board positions would be filled by the 2013 Annual General Meeting
- **Redevelopment:** To identify solutions regarding location, space and provincial hall satellite locations
 - The Board continues to work extensively with all interested parties, and potential partners, in support of a new facility.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

The Saskatchewan Sports Hall of Fame (SSHF) completed a very successful year with expanded programming, engaging projects, and some exciting community partnerships. The continued evaluation of all initiatives within the context of the top line strategy got us all thinking differently.

• Awareness/Self-Help:

- Financial support from Saskatchewan Lotteries to continue the digitization of the permanent collection
- Funding through the Community Initiatives Fund to produce a series of Grey Cup vignettes
- The establishment of community partnerships with the Saskatchewan Roughrider Alumni Association, Regina Downtown, MacKenzie Art Gallery, Information Services Corporation, Command Base Creative Design, and Fire Cube Video Services in support of new fundraising and programming initiatives
- A full roster of exhibits capitalizing on the accomplishments of our honoured members and key components of the permanent collection

• Redevelopment:

- The ongoing digitization of our permanent collection which will allow us to incorporate more content from the collection into exhibits and online activities
- The ongoing updates to our collections inventory database based on (1) accession records and (2) catalogue records

Through the hard work, creativity and commitment of staff, volunteers and management, the SSHF capped off a productive and successful year and positioned us for continued success in the years ahead. As we move ahead we also say goodbye to staff members Jenna Parker (Education and Online Coordinator) and Lorrie Pettigrew (Collections Manager). We look forward to what's ahead for the SSHF in 2014 with a new staffing team.





- 488 inductees from 53 sports are in the Hall of Fame, representing 130 communities in Saskatchewan
- The permanent collection contains more than 12,000 items valued at over \$1 Million
- There are currently 14,525 digitized scans of items within the permanent collection including:
 - o 73,800 individual scanned pages comprising 2,689 individual archives
 - o 6,539 individual photographs
 - o 5,297 artifacts
