DID YOU KNOW.....

- 498 inductees from 53 sports are in the Hall of Fame, representing 130 communities in Saskatchewan
- The permanent collection contains more than 12,000 items valued at over \$1 Million
- There are currently over 17,000 digitized scans of items within the permanent collection including:
 - 74,000 scanned pages comprising 2,965 individual archives
 - 9,023 individual photographs

PRESIDENT’S REPORT

On behalf of the Board of the Saskatchewan Sports Hall of Fame (SSHF), I would like to thank the staff and volunteers for making 2014 another great year. The top line strategy established in 2011 continues to serve as our organizational road map. This annual report will outline a few of the SSHF’s key activities as we continue to progress through the goals established within the strategy.

- **Self-Help:** Move towards a self-sustaining business model to run parallel with Saskatchewan Lotteries core funding.
 - The Sports Investors Club, now in its 3rd year, garnered 17 Teammates and 3 All Star contributors
 - Sport Legacy Fund grew to \$21,778, an increase of over \$5K from 2013
 - The Board and staff participated in a Fundraising Strategic Planning session on March 7, 2015 to re-affirm and expand the top line strategy
 - The SSHF finished its 3rd consecutive fiscal year in positive financial territory
- **Awareness:** To amplify awareness of the SSHF within the province.
 - A President’s Reception was hosted in Saskatoon on November 4 and in Regina on December 6, 2014
 - Under the Collection Management partnership with the Saskatchewan Hockey Hall of Fame (Swift Current), 11 inductee exhibits were fabricated along with some general hockey-related exhibits
 - Monthly eBlasts promoting “What’s On” and directing traffic to our website and social media platforms which continued to produce gains in visits, length of stay and overall reach
 - *Hometown Heroes*, sponsored by Watt’s Electric, promoting the stories of our inductees through Rawlco Radio
- **Board Development:** To create an effective and qualified Board that is conscious of its own role and responsibilities; that is motivated by the mission of the organization; and that is willing and able to actively participate in Board leadership.
 - Board Retreat was held on September 20-21, 2014 in Waskesiu to continue the strategic review process for the next three years, reaffirm our organizational priorities, and confirm our strategic goals
- **Redevelopment:** To identify solutions regarding location, space and provincial hall satellite locations
 - The Board continues to work extensively with all interested parties, and potential partners, in support of a new facility
 - Allocated funding for Gallery interactive & multi-media improvements to enhance the visitor experience

- **Awareness/Self-Help:**
 - “ISHY” Award Recipient – our website was voted “Best in the Industry” by the International Sports Heritage Association
 - The continuation of community partnerships with the Saskatchewan Roughrider Alumni Association, Regina Downtown, Command Base Creative Design, PacketWire, Fire Cube Video Services, and Watt’s Electric in support of new fundraising and programming initiatives
 - A full roster of exhibits capitalizing on the accomplishments of our honoured members and key components of the permanent collection
 - *Exploration Days for Kids* and *Sports In Shorts* summer programming
 - *2014 Saskatchewan Sochi Olympian & Paralympian Autograph session*, and *Rogers Hometown Hockey* special event programming
- **Redevelopment:**
 - The installation of a multi-sport simulator to enhance the visitor experience through curriculum based programming & engagement opportunities
 - The installation of video monitors to enhance the visitor experience through expanded multi-media exhibit capabilities
