The SSHF will be celebrating our previous Olympic champions and keeping an eye on our gold medal contenders in *From Chamonix to Pyeongchang: Saskatchewan at the Winter Olympics*. This exhibit will officially open on February 5, 2018.

SSHF BECOMES REGINA PATS OFFICIAL REPOSITORY

Thanks to a new partnership with the Regina Pats, the history of the world's oldest major-junior hockey team is in good hands. Under the agreement, the SSHF will serve as the official repository for the Regina Pats permanent collection. This partnership represents the first of its kind with a Saskatchewan based Western Hockey League franchise.

"Ensuring the preservation of our history for generations to come is very important to the organization," said Regina Pats Chief Operating Officer Stacey Cattell. "As the experts in this field, it only makes sense to partner with a Saskatchewan institution like the Sports Hall of Fame. It will be in a place our fans know and in the future can go to and appreciate the rich history of Regina Pats hockey."

The current Pats collection has been placed into safekeeping with the SSHF. Going forward, every effort will be made by the Regina Pats to ensure the ongoing history of the 100 year old franchise is captured through the addition of artifacts and archival documents to our permanent collection.

As part of the team's centennial celebration during the 2017/18 season, a new installation has been done at the Brandt Centre. Ten new exhibits celebrate different components of the last 100 years. The exhibit can be viewed along the north side of the Brandt Centre in the Link (connecting Queensbury and the Brandt Centre). The installation will stay in place throughout the 2017/18 season until the conclusion of the 2018 MasterCard Memorial Cup.

INDUCTEE NOTES

Congratulations are extended to the following honoured members of the SSHF on their most recent accomplishments.



Terry Hincks (Football – 1973 & 1978) On October 30, 2017, the City Council voted unanimously to rename the Lakeridge skateboard park in Regina in honour of Terry Hincks. Terry was a longtime supporter of youth sports and was strongly in favour of the skateboard park. He passed away after a lengthy battle with cancer in October, 2016.

Gordie Howe (Hockey – 1971) On September 27, 2017, Canada Post unveiled a series of Canadian hockey legends to conclude its five-year NHL stamp collection at the Hockey Hall of Fame. Gordie was selected along with an elite group of individuals including Maurice Richard, Jean Béliveau, Bobby Orr, Mario Lemieux and Wayne Gretzky. This final installment will serve to celebrate the 125th anniversary of the Stanley Cup.

Duncan "Dunc" Fisher (Hockey – 2011) A natural athlete, Dunc first established himself as a hockey player with his hometown team, the Regina Pats. By the 1948 season the talented goal scorer made the jump to the National Hockey League and suited up with the New York Rangers. After his playing days were over, Dunc returned to Regina as manager of the Lawson Aquatic Centre. Dunc passed away on September 22, 2017, shortly after his 90th birthday.
