# **IN MEMORIAM**

The members of the Board and staff extend their sincere sympathies to the family and friends of Allan, Craig and Dick.



**Allan Few (Judo Builder – 2005),** Allan began his association with judo at the Saskatoon YMCA in 1953 – the province's first judo club – and when the new YMCA building was being designed he was a driving force in ensuring the club would have a good facility in the new structure. He attained the rank of Godan (Fifth Degree Black Belt) and gave back to the sport through coaching, refereeing and grading. He taught judo courses through the University of Regina, giving the sport wider exposure. He began working as a referee in 1966 and would referee on the national stage and also served as the Judo chair at the Jeux Canada Games. He also served as a board member with the Saskatoon Hall of Fame. Allan passed away on May 7, 2020, at the age of 87.

**Craig Mackay (Speed Skating – 1973)**, Craig took up speed skating in Saskatoon in 1943 and won his first provincial title a year later. In 1947, Craig won his first national medal, winning the Senior Men's Three Mile event. In 1948, he represented Canada at the Olympic Games in St. Moritz, placing 13th overall. At the 1952 Olympics in Oslo, he placed 11th in the 5,000-metres and 13th in the 10,000-metres. He was also an alternate on the 1956 and 1960 Olympic teams. Craig passed away on February 28, 2020, at the age of 92.





**Richard "Dick" Rendek (Multi Sport Builder – 1997)**, Dick chaired the bid committee to secure the first Grey Cup in Regina in 1995. He was also the fundraising chair of the Taylor Field expansion, raising more than \$1 million in the late 1970s. Dick joined the board of directors of the Saskatchewan Roughriders in 1977, serving as president from 1982-84. He was the chairman of the inaugural Western Canada Summer Games, a member of the Canadian Olympic Association, and served on the board of governors of the Canadian Football League. Dick also served on the boards of directors of the Regina YMCA, the Regina Exhibition Association, and the Saskatchewan Sports Hall of Fame. Dick passed away on March 1, 2020, at the age of 88.

Congratulations are extended to the following honoured members of the SSHF on their most recent accomplishments:

**Dick White (Builder – 2015)** Dick White was named the interim CEO of U Sports, the national governing body of Canadian university sport.

**Diane Jones Konihowski** (Athletics — 1980) Diane Jones Konihowski will be inducted into Canada's Sports Hall of Fame as part of a combined 2020-21 class. Jones Konihowski is a two-time Olympian and a Commonwealth Games gold medalist in the pentathlon in 1978 in Edmonton.

#### 2020 Induction Dinner & Ceremony moved to 2021

The Board of Directors of the Saskatchewan Sports Hall of Fame (SSHF) made the difficult decision to cancel the 2020 Induction Dinner & Ceremony scheduled for September 26, 2020, due to health and safety concerns associated with the COVID-19 pandemic.

The 2020 Induction Class will be carried forward as the Class of 2021. Their induction is now scheduled to occur in September 2021.

The SSHF has been closely monitoring developments since social distancing protocols were put in place by the Government of Saskatchewan in March. The health and welfare of our inductees, their families and friends, patrons, staff, volunteers and suppliers remains front of mind. Given the continued uncertainty relating to when groups could gather safely and without restriction, the SSHF and its Board of Directors felt this cancelation was the most prudent course of action. Serious consideration was given to other creative means to honour our 2020 Class virtually. Ultimately, the decision to cancel was made based on our concern for what would be best for our inductees. By delaying a year, the SSHF wanted to ensure that their induction night would be an opportunity to come together with family, friends, teammates and the Saskatchewan sporting community to celebrate their accomplishments.

In addition to moving the Class of 2020 forward, any nominees still under consideration will retain an extra year of eligibility. Our next nomination deadline is now October 31, 2021 and we encourage anyone who has an athlete, team or builder that they feel is worthy of inclusion in the Hall of Fame to please take the time to nominate them.

The Class of **2021** will be unveiled at a later date.
